Summer Lunch Program a Success

Kenton City Schools' summer lunch program started Monday, June 7, and served meals Monday through Thursday until July 29. 3,239 meals, an average of 215 children daily, were served during the month of June at sites throughout Kenton.

Every three years, the Ohio Department of Education conducts a Summer Lunch Review to make sure lunch sites are in compliance with all state regulations. Kenton's



program exceeded all USDA guidelines, and no corrective actions were needed. The Children's Hunger Alliance, being so pleased with Kenton's summer lunch program, brought State Representative Cliff Hite to Kenton to visit the Forest Court Apartments lunch site during lunch on July 27, 2010.

Kenton City Schools has received grants in the past from Children's Hunger Alliance to help offset costs relating to the summer lunch program, and the Alliance has been very satisfied with the operation of the program and how the program has grown. Beginning with four sites four years ago, where served 2,470 meals were served, the program has grown to nine sites, serving nearly 6,500 meals this summer.

As summer quickly draws to a close for Kenton students, the Kenton City Schools' teachers and staff have been hard at work preparing for an outstanding school year. Summer cleaning crews have been busy preparing facilities and moving a number of classrooms.


During the week of June 14-19, many teachers worked with the

district's literacy consultant, **Eve Hayes**, to plan and develop the balanced literacy framework implemented in elementary classrooms. Eve returned during the week of August 2-6 to meet with each elementary grade level individually.

"Our staff has worked extra hard this summer to prepare for the school year. We are expecting continued excellence across the district," said **Doug Roberts**, Kenton City Schools' superintendent.

Kenton City Schools will open the 2010-2011 year with a district-wide staff meeting on Thursday, August 19, 2010. Classes will begin for students on Monday, August 23, 2010, with a full-day schedule for students in grades K through 12. 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KCS Nurse's News

School will soon be starting, and parents and students will be gearing up for the big day!

Kenton City Schools requires that all incoming kindergarten and preschool students be fully immunized by the start of school with up-to-date vaccinations required by the Ohio Department of Health. For kindergarten students, these vaccines include 5 DtAP, 4 Polio, 3 Hepatitis B, 2 MMR, and 2 Varicella (chickenpox). Proof of vaccines your child has received since kindergarten screening must be brought to the Westview Kindergarten Center office. All kindergarten students who attended kindergarten screening earlier this spring were informed as to which vaccines were needed, if any, before the start of school. Preschool-aged children must be up to date on vaccinations for their particular age. You can check with your child's physician or the Kenton Hardin Health Department for these details. The health department's number is 419-673-6230.

There is a new Ohio Department of Health immunization required for incoming 7th grade students before the start of school. This vaccine is Diphtheria-Pertussis-Tetanus booster (DtAP). The reason requirement is the increased rate of children of this age group contracting whooping cough or pertussis. Your child can receive this vaccine at the Kenton Hardin Health Department on Thursdays from 8:30 a.m. until 12:00 p.m. and again from 1:00 p.m. until 4:00 p.m. The cost is \$10.00 unless your child is on Medicaid or you have any inability to pay. If your child is on Medicaid, please take his Medicaid card with you at the time the vaccine is to be given. Proof of the vaccine must be brought to the Kenton Middle School office before the start of school on August 23.

KCS Lice Policy Explained

With the recent news about public schools' views on allowing children to attend school with head lice, I think I need to clarify Kenton City Schools' board policy regarding lice.

Children are to be lice and nit free before they can attend school. It is important to read over-the-counter treatment instructions or the prescription inserts since there are risks involved in over-treating. If you find head lice or nits on your child's hair, please inform the school where your child(ren) attend so that I may check others.

Your child must be checked by either the Kenton City Schools' nurse, your child's physician, or by a nurse at the Kenton Hardin Health Department before the child can return to school.

If you need assistance with obtaining treatments, please call me at 419-673-0775, option 6."

If you have a religious, philosophical, or medical reason for your child not to receive any of the vaccines, you must complete a letter of declination form before school starts. This form is located at the Kenton City Schools' board office, Westview Kindergarten Center office, and the Kenton Middle School office. If you have any questions about these vaccines, please call the health department or your child's physician.

Once school starts, please keep your telephone numbers up to date since that is the only mechanism the school has to contact you if your child is ill or hurt at school.

If your child is ill, has a temperature of 100 degrees or higher, please keep the child at home until he or she is well. Sending an ill child to school is very difficult for the ill child since schools are not equipped to care for your child.

I hope each child has a wonderful year of fun, learning, meeting new friends, seeing old friends, and gaining greater self-esteem through learning.

NEW STUDENTS

Parents of students who are new to the district are urged to register their children prior to the first day. To enroll a new student, contact the following:

Kindergarten - Contact the Westview Kindergarten Center at 419-673-4294. Leave a message if there is no answer, and someone will get back with you. Students must go through the screening before being admitted to school.

Grades 1-5 - Stop by the Superintendent's office at 222 W. Carrol Street or call Kathy Reffner at 419-673-0775 for enrollment information. Office hours are 8:00-4:00.

Grades 6-8 - Contact the Kenton Middle School at 419-673-1237.

Grades 9-12 - Contact Kenton High School 419-673-1286.

Previous school records, birth certificate, shot records, social security card, and a copy of custody papers if there has been a divorce or separation in the family are required documents which must be presented upon enrollment of new students.

Bus Information

Bus routes will remain basically the same as last year. Some changes may be made due to move-ins and move-outs. Students who plan to ride the bus are requested to be ready 15-20 minutes early. If some problems are experienced the first day, parents are asked to have patience as the "bugs" are worked out. Any questions regarding bus transportation should be directed to the bus garage at 419-675-0887.

BUS ROUTES ARE ESTABLISHED BY THE TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT BASED UPON THE FOLLOWING:

- A. Shortest and safest routes based upon legal residence of student
- B. Routes may change during the school year as students move in or out of the district
- C. Routes may change during the school year as students are transported by parents or drive themselves on a regular basis.

SPECIAL SITUATIONS

- 1. Students will be regularly picked up and dropped off at places other than their legal residence provided:
 - A. The bus does not have to go off its established route
 - B. Space is available
 - C. Written permission by parent or guardian
- 2. Students wishing to ride home with another student may do so provided:
 - A. The driver is given a note signed by the teacher or principal
 - B. There is space on the bus

The cafeteria will be in operation beginning Monday, August 23.

Free and reduced price lunch applications will be distributed on the first day of school for elementary students and mailed in the middle and high school newsletters. One application per family is required. These applications should be completed and returned as soon as possible. Eligibility requirements for free and reduced price lunches are given with the application materials.

Bus Safety Reminder

When a bus is stopped (four red lights are flashing - two in the front and two in the rear) on a street or road which has fewer than four lanes, all traffic approaching the bus from either direction must stop at least ten feet from the front or the rear of the bus and remain stopped until the bus begins to move or the bus driver signals motorists to proceed. If a bus is stopped on a street or road which has four or more lanes, only the traffic proceeding in the same direction as the bus must stop.



2010-2011 School Fees

Directory Information



The Board designates as student "directory information" a student's name, address, telephone number, date and place of birth, major field of study, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, height and weight, if a member of an athletic team, dates of attendance, date of graduation, and awards received.

Parents and adult students may refuse to allow the District to disclose any or all of such "directory information" upon written notification to the District within ten (10) days after receipt of the District's public notice.



KHS Students Design Yearbook in Class

Designed entirely by students, the 2010 yearbook is in full color with 144 themed pages. 


